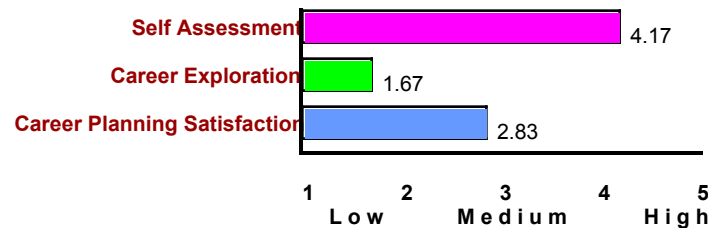

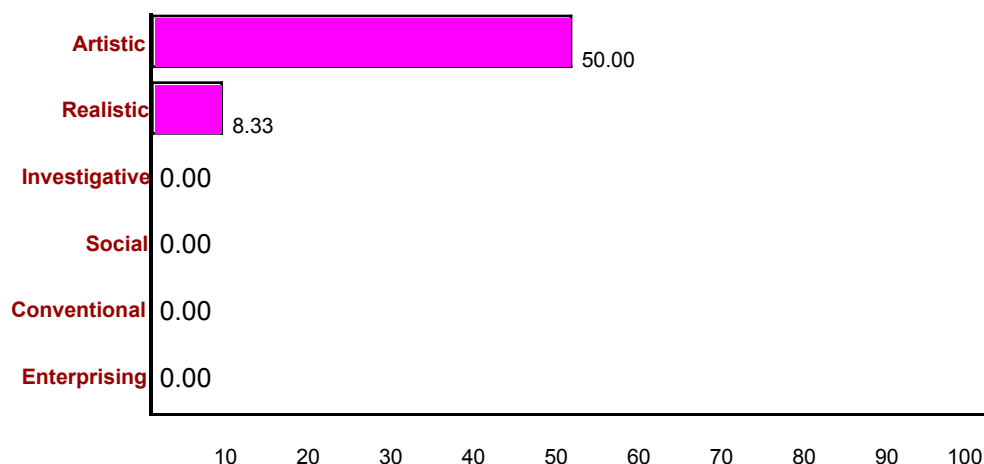

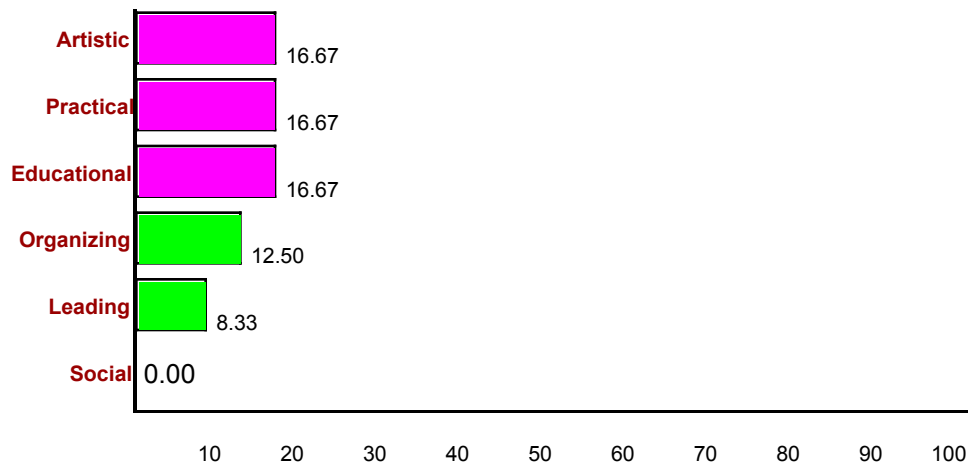
Artistic
